

Police Seek Information Concerning Anti-Social Paraglider At Bexhill - 29.08.18

Police are asking for witnesses to come forward to support an investigation, in conjunction with the Civil Aviation Authority, into a para-glider who uses Galley Hill, Bexhill-on-Sea, as a launch site. Over the past two years Sussex Police has received reports of the para-glider causing criminal damage, obstructing the highway, being abusive and hostile towards members of the public and generally behaving in an anti-social manner.

It has also been alleged he intimidates people by flying low over the seafront.

Sergeant Simon Barden, of the Hastings and Rother police prevention team, said: "We'd like to hear from anyone who has seen or experienced aggressive or disturbing approaches from this man."
